

Thank you for contacting the Bartlett Historical Society regarding your search for the Emery family of Bartlett. BHS president, Norman Head, has asked me to respond to your letter of 08 Aug. My name is Marcia Dolley and my "hobby" is researching and compiling information on the families of Bartlett.

First, let me say that the vital records for Bartlett prior to the mid 1860's are very scarce and so much of my research is dependent on the US Census records and individual family records. I have compiled a fairly large file of Emery(s) in Bartlett, with several with some connection to Bartlett which I have been unable to place, in the miscellaneous file...

In that miscellaneous file I have the following information on Barzilla Emery, son of Albert Emery and Caroline Harriman:

Barzilla Emery (22) b. Bartlett, NH s/o Albert E. Emery and Caroline E. Harriman m. 1st 13 Jul 1880 at Strafford, NH Addie A. Blodgett (23) b. Strafford, NH d/o Lucy A. Blodgett . They had a child, Fanny A. b. abt. 1906

Barzilla Emery (64) b. Bartlett s/o Albert Emery & Elizabeth Harriman m. 2nd 13 Jul 1921 at Strafford, NH Bertha Corse (54) b. Montpelier, Vt. d/o John Thayer & Menerva Tomlinson

Barzilla Emery (66) b. Bartlett s/o Albert Emery & Caroline E. Harriman m. 3rd 25 Aug 1924 Mary Perkins (65) b. Weston, ME d/o William Cumberland & Bridgett Templeton

Albert Emery, is also in my miscellaneous file, because the only info I have on him is as follows:

1850 US Census- Bartlett, Albert (23) est. b. abt. 1827 with Caroline (19)

Albert Emery m. 19 Sep 1850 at Bartlett Caroline O. Harriman

1860 US Census at Bartlett Albert, with Caroline and Barzilla.

The only information I have on Albert Emery and Martha Jane Littlefield are two vital records from the town of Conway regarding **Susie Emery** (30) d/o Albert Emery & Martha Littlefield who married 04 Apr 1896 at Kearsarge (a village located in the towns of Bartlett and Conway) George E. Johnson ()

Also a d.r. of **Susie Johnson** who died on 21 Sep 1897 @ 33yrs at Conway. According to the d.r. she would have been born in Bartlett abt. 1864. I have been unable to locate a gravesite for Susie or George in either Bartlett or Conway.

I have placed this family in my Emery Misc file because the limited information available to me provides no evidence of Albert's parents.

-Regarding **Barzilla Emery**, b. abt. 1800; **Gilbert Emery**, b. abt. 1814; **Stephen Emery**, b. abt. 1827; **Laura A. Emery**, b. abt. 1838; and **Charles H. Emery**, b. abt. 1847, I would think that the time span of 47 years would indicate either more than one marriage or the possibility that they do not belong to a family as siblings. I would be interested of learning of your source for these records. -According to my files, Barzilla Emery & Gilbert Emery are sons of Sylvanus & Dolly Emery, and Laura Emery and Charles Emery are the children of Barzilla & Hannah Emery.

We have three major cemeteries in Bartlett and I visited each of them as I was researching the Emery family and I have recorded 19 Emery(s) in those cemeteries. However, Albert and his family are not among these 19 gravesites, which is not unusual for the earlier families in town, as they were most likely buried in small family graveyards with wooden or fieldstone marker to locate the site. Of course, those graveyards are no longer evident. However, it would seem that Albert's death would have been late enough to show up in town records, but not so for Bartlett. Perhaps he moved from Bartlett, but I have not been able to locate him. I have been to the State Library to research this family, and have not found anything on Albert Emery or Charles Albert Emery born in Bartlett. As you may have already guessed, I did find Emery families throughout the state and in many of the towns in the New England states.

I have no information on Susie Williemy Emery and Her husband Frank, and Frank Emery nor any family in

Ossipee.

There is one Emery family in Bartlett, but I think they would be of little help to you in your search, as I contacted them several years ago when I was compiling this family and they had no records available. In fact, I compiled a short history of their Emery father and connected him back to the Emery(s) of Bartlett even though he was born and raised in Northern New Hampshire.

My file on the Emery family of Bartlett is substantial; however, please note the following statement which I add to each family record: "The purpose of my research is not to record a genealogical family history, but to provide documentation for the family while in Bartlett. Occasionally it has been necessary to record related family information from other towns in order to tie in the Bartlett individual. It should be noted that many of the Bartlett families migrated to other towns near and far, but that research has not been conducted for the purpose of this study. Occasionally, I have been fortunate enough to find early genealogical research which was compiled, before the days of internet and published vital records, with info provided by family members. In this case I usually include that information with my family sketch"

That being stated, I would be very glad to work with you on your search for your Bartlett Emery family. Also, I would be most appreciative of any documented information which you may have on the Bartlett Emery(s) which I have not included here. If I have provided inaccurate information I would also be most pleased if you would care to share any documented corrections. I would also appreciate any of your family history since your ancestors were located in Bartlett. It is my goal to complete the family histories to the extent possible, and to one day make a gift of my work to the Bartlett Historical Society.
